Her smile; That's what we all are remembering in this moment. The warmth of her presence. A presence that began in a small town outside of Philadelphia, Mississippi on January 27th, 1934. Her parents Henry and Maudie Culberson raised Dora Lee along with her other siblings – Eugene (Gene), Robert (Sonny), Evelyn (Rabbit), Sharon (Dusty), Patricia (Patsy) and Geraldine (Tiny).

Around the year 1940, during the Great Migration, the family moved to the Southside of Chicago from Mississippi. She attended Stephen A. Douglas Elementary School and Wendell Philips High School. When she was 14 she met Willie Lee Ellington. Willie and Dora got married on September 16th, 1952.

Their union produced 7 children – Charlene, Debra, Diane, Willie, Maurice (deceased), Sharon and Andrea. Those 6 children produced 21 grandchildren – and the greats and great-great grandchildren came into existence over the years. Amazingly, she was able to see not only her grandchildren grow up, but even had the chance to see a few of her great-great grands – what a life.

What a life she led, indeed. She traveled the world. She was a hard worker that dedicated 33 and half years to the post office and developed life-long friendships that lasted till this day. But most important of all, she was a woman of great spirituality. At the age of 25 she dedicated her life to Jehovah in April of 1960.
