Paul's most recent successful kidney transplant was received in August 2018. Although he experienced set-backs post-transplant with other health challenges, he had another chance of life without dependency on dialysis. His "new" kidney never failed (even to the very end).

As his family we were proud of the son, brother, father, uncle, nephew, cousin, and friend to many that he was. He was a true example of perseverance and determination and he will always be our hero.
