Annie Pearl Cole McClendon (Pansy) was born June 17, 1936 in Louise, Mississippi, as she would say, by way of Yazoo City, to the proud and loving parents Mae Atrice and Clark Cole Sr. She was the oldest of sixteen siblings.

Annie attended Humphrey County Training Center in Louise, MS. She later left Louise, MS in 1955 and moved to Chicago Heights, Illinois. She then met and married Jimmy Louis McClendon on September 28, 1956, and to this union, they raised 10 children and two adopted grandchildren.

On January 21, 1961, Annie Pearl made one of the most important decisions of her life by making a personal dedication to Jehovah God and symbolized her dedication by water baptism.
