



## Barbara Ferguson

February 9, 1941 - February 6, 2015

On February 9, 1941, a daughter was born to Marshall and Huberta Flenoy, Barbara Jean Flenoy.

In December of 1957, in Cleveland, Ohio, Barbara married Julius Ferguson. To that union three sons were born. After their divorce, with the assistance and support of her brother Darryl, Barbara and her sons moved to Chicago, Illinois.

In Chicago, through Jehovah's Witnesses, Barbara was introduced to God's word the Bible. She once commented on how she loved fairy tales as a child because everyone lived happily ever after and that Jehovah's promises were better because they were real. After an in depth study of the Bible, Barbara symbolized her dedication to Jehovah through water baptism on July 25, 1969.

Barbara worked for the Social Security Administration and The Hosiery Mate Company. Although there were struggles, her most rewarding career was raising her sons and her pioneer work with the Lake Meadows and Kenwood Congregation. When her health no longer permitted her to pioneer, Barbara moved to North Washington Park Manor Living Center and continued serving Jehovah as a publisher with the Hyde Park Congregation. She faithfully served Jehovah for over 45 years.

On February 6, 2015, Barbara fell asleep in death. Preceding her in death were her mother and father; her sister, Angel; and her brothers, Sonny and Timothy Flenoy.
