Lisa attended James Madison Elementary School and Chicago Vocational High School. During high school, Lisa participated with the Jr. ROTC and excelled in carpentry classes. Lisa attended Roosevelt University where she majored in Psychology. Lisa was blessed to have participated in the CARA program which provided hope and opportunities to individuals in the community who needed it the most. This program assisted Lisa in obtaining employment with Cook County.

Lisa worked with the Cook County Assessors Office for over ten years. She was familiar with many Cook County elected officials and established a working relationship with them.

Lisa was very knowledgeable of tax laws and was happy to assist family members and friends with resolving their tax issues and concerns. Because of Lisa's hard work and dedication, she was recently promoted. However, she did not get the opportunity to transition into the position. Unfortunately, Lisa's health began to fail and on September 21, 2016, she was rushed to the hospital. After a courageous fight, Lisa entered into her heavenly home on October 4, 2016.

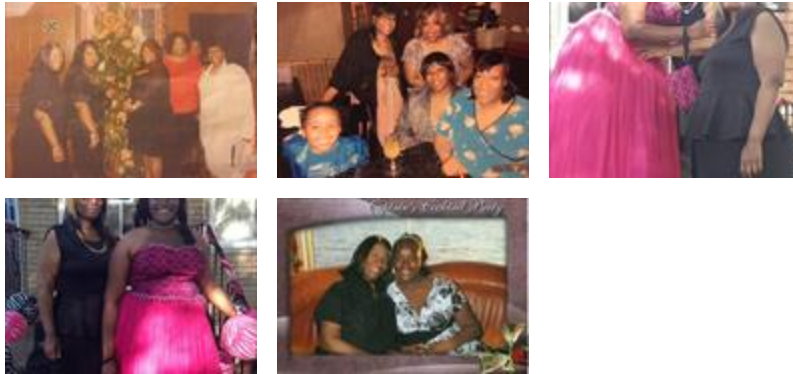
