Eventually her children began to look forward to those "dusties" and Sunday dinner with mom each week. Her love of music fueled her son Patrick's love of music and they enjoyed many trips to the local record stores in Hyde Park.

Jeanette loved people and will be remembered for her warm personality, beautiful brown eyes and golden smile. Everyone that met her was drawn to her and called her "mom" or "moms". She will also be remembered for her big heart and generosity. She would help anyone even strangers. We would ask her, "Why are you helping that person?" She would always say, "Because you never know what situation you might be in and need help."

Jeanette tremendously loved her four grandchildren Sydnei, Christion, Karter and Brees. They were her pride and joy! She had the joy of seeing her oldest grandchild Sydnei graduate from college with her bachelor's in Nursing. She cherished the moment of recently being able to hold her last grandchild Brees.

Jeanette retired in 2015 from being a home healthcare provider and took up the full-time ministry in 2018. She had the privilege of attending pioneer school in 2019 with her daughter Fenecia. It was a joy she often talked

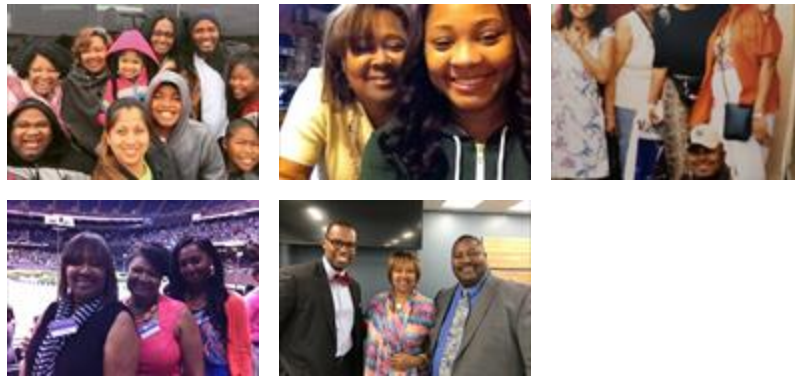
