Marie-Ermithe was an excellent cook and received much praise for her fine meals she provided occasionally. She always had to buy the very best to cook for her family and friends. Our dear sister Marie Ermithe Chadic ran the race to the finish and we saw her determination to serve Jehovah faithfully till the end. We are happy to have known her, but we will see her soon in the new system. Jehovah is and was Marie-Ermithe Chadic's heavenly Father, God, and Friend, and as Hebrews 6:10 insists he remembers everything she has done for his name and for her family and friends.
