



## Mattie Walker

June 19, 1924 - January 5, 2015

Mattie Walker was born June 19, 1924. She was one of four daughters and one son born to the union of Arnett and Viola Banks. Mattie received her education in Vaughn, Mississippi where she was born and lived until about 14 years old when she moved with her family to Chicago, Illinois.

On May 26, 1960 Mattie united in wedlock with A.D. Walker.

After a careful study of the Bible, Mattie dedicated her life to Jehovah and symbolized her dedication through water baptism on December 23, 1972, becoming one of Jehovah's Witnesses. She started her spiritual journey at the Hyde Park Congregation in Chicago, Illinois and served Jehovah there until 1995 when the harsh Chicago weather caused her to relocate and live with family members in El Cajon, California. There she continuously auxiliary pioneered for several years. In September 2000 she became a regular pioneer and continued to do so until she became ill in 2008 and relocated to Louisville, Kentucky where she could be with family that could care for her. She loved and lived for the ministry and talking about the truth of God to others.

Mattie always set a good example that drew many people to the truth. The most important person was her husband A.D. Walker who symbolized his dedication to Jehovah in June 1989. Even though they had no biological

children, they experienced the truth of Jesus' words at Mark 10:29,30. They received children HUNDREDFOLD.

On January 5, 2015, Mattie fell asleep in death. She was preceded in death by her husband, A.D. Walker; her mother, Viola Banks; her father, Arnett Banks; two sisters, Juanita Coleman and Rosie Mae Banks; and one brother, Arnett Banks Jr.

Mattie leaves to cherish her memories, her loving sister, Lerline Evans; and a host of nieces, nephews, great nieces, great nephews, great-great nieces, great-great nephews and spiritual children that they cannot be counted.
