



Minnie Eleanor Sirnash

February 22, 1933 - June 6, 2017

On February 22, 1933, in Mount Airy, North Carolina, Minnie Eleanor Fulton was born to her parents, Earl Fulton and Martha Crops Fulton. She was one of five children being the only girl with four brothers. She was affectionately known to her family and friends as "Lil Minnie".

After becoming acquainted with Jehovah's people, Minnie accepted a Bible study. She dedicated her life to Jehovah and symbolized her dedication through water baptism on June 16, 1992, becoming a Jehovah's Witness.

Minnie grew up here in the Chicago and after finishing high school she decided to become a nurse so she could help people. She took care of her mother and her two brothers until they fell asleep in death. Minnie worked at Michael Reese Hospital for 33 years as a nurse.

Minnie loved to travel, cook, shop, dress and entertain family and friends. Just months before she became ill, she felt the need to cook for a gathering to invite her Christian brothers.

Minnie met her devoted and loving husband, Daniel, on a cruise ship in 1971 and they were united in holy matrimony on February 4, 1975. On every visit to the hospital, Danny, as he was called by Minnie, reassured her that he loved, respected and would be there for her.

On Tuesday, June 6, 2017, Minnie fell asleep in death surrounded by her loving husband, Daniel and loving friends.

Minnie leaves to cherish her memories, her loving husband, Daniel Hope Sirnash; one godson, Barrington Forrester Jr.; two special cousins, Alma Richmond, who is 101 years old and Milton Haynes Jr., who called and visited Minnie as often as possible; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, neighbors and friends
