



## Ora Mae Simpson

January 12, 1917 - July 12, 2012

Ora Mae Simpson was born on January 12, 1917 in Mississippi to Willie B. Edwards-Grayson and Dick Simpson.

In 1953, Ora relocated to Chicago, Illinois. As the provider for her family and household she was a domestic engineer.

After a careful study of God's word, which began by Witnesses in the door-to-door ministry, Ora learned about Jehovah. She dedicated her life to Jehovah and symbolized her dedication through water baptism on August 30, 1958 at the International Convention in New York City. Six years after her baptism, on June 1, 1963, she began to regular pioneer. It was through her love for people Ora has helped many gain an accurate knowledge about Jehovah.

Many have followed Ora's example of having a self-sacrificing spirit and joined her in the regular pioneer work and have gone on to become elders and traveling overseers. By means of Jehovah's holy spirit she has aided more than 100 people into Jehovah's loving organization. She was never missing from the meeting and was often referred to as the prophetess Anna found at Luke 2:36, 37.

On July 12, 2012 Ora fell asleep in death. She was preceded in death by her parents; her children, Leroy Lewis, Charley Mae McGee and Waliey

Summers; and three grandchildren.

Ora leaves to cherish her memories, one daughter, Viola Lewis-Stevens; one sister, Leola Barcy; 11 grandchildren; 40 great-grandchildren; a host of great-great and great-great-great grandchildren, nieces, nephews, and many dear close friends.
