Rosetta (Phillips) Wallace was born on April 14, 1935, in Wrightsville, Arkansas, to Thom Phillips and Bernice (Stubbs) Phillips, who preceded her in death. She was the oldest of four siblings; two sisters: Jean and Birdina, and one brother, Robert, who also preceded her in death.

Her family moved to Chicago in 1943; years later, she met and married Dave Wallace in her twenties. To this union were born three children: Darrell, James Allen, and Angela and two grandchildren, Antoine and Kizzy, all of whom also preceded her in death.

Rosetta dedicated her life to Jehovah God and was baptized in 1958 as one of Jehovah's Witnesses. She was a dynamic, hard-working sister.
