Stacy Patterson was born Stacy Carnell Reid on April 3, 1964 in Chicago, IL to her parents, Howard Daniel Reid and Mary Louise Reid. She was the 2nd child of 4 born out of that union.

Stacy graduated from Percy L. Julian High School on Chicago's South Side in 1982. She would fondly speak of the school's regarded arts, theatre and prestigious sports program during that time. Stacy was known for her loving and caring attitude, easy going personality, and her gift of gab. She touched the lives of many and assisted many families in times of need. Stacy enjoyed spending time with family. A family favorite was a card game affectionately known as "squeak". She liked crocheting various items, was an official "House Head" enjoying listening to Chicago House Music, but was primarily known as a skater. It was her passion. Especially on the JB's (James Brown) night, you would find her on the skating rink floor front and center no matter what. She was an artistic, industrious, and hardworking woman. Stacy would engage in many do-it-yourself projects around the house with her own artistic flare, she took pride in her work.

That same work ethic she also applied to her secular work as well, where she became a valuable employee to Aldi Foods in a supervisory role for many years. From there, she transitioned into the construction trades, where she finished her career as a Journey-woman Electrician as a member of the IBEW

Local 134 in Chicago.

What really defined Stacy's life was her faith and personal relationship with her God Jehovah. She embraced the teachings of the Bible, what it says about Jehovah, and His promises for the future. This motivated her, along with her mother, to both dedicate their lives to Jehovah God and symbolized that dedication through water baptism on October 4th, 1980. Her love for Jehovah grew so strong that it moved Stacy with zeal to do more in service to him. She soon decided to become a regular pioneer, devoting more time in the preaching and teaching work with her spiritual family. 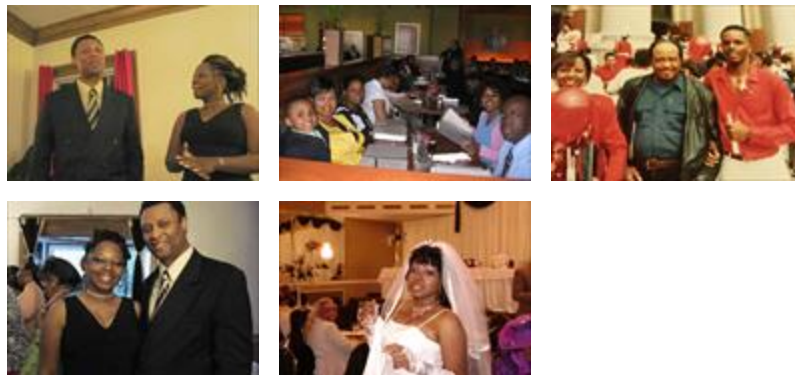
